Teaching Arrangement for the 2nd Semester of Academic Year 2021/2022

Dear Postgraduate Students,

We would like to inform you about the following teaching arrangements for the 2nd semester of academic year 2021/2022:

1. University Almanac and Important Dates

The classes for the coming semester will begin on **6 January 2022** and you may refer to the Graduate School's webpage for the 2021/2022 University Almanac and Important Dates (<https://grs.um.edu.mo/index.php/current-students/university-almanac-and-important-dates/>) for the details.

2. Teaching Mode

All teaching activities will be normally arranged and classes will mainly be arranged on a face-to-face teaching basis. If students are not permitted to enter Macao by the Macao SAR Government, the University will arrange online classes for these students.

Students are required to attend the face-to-face classes on campus during the classroom teaching period and the requirement of 80% class attendance will be applied as normal.	Students' class attendance will not be considered but they will still be required to meet the participation requirements advised by the teachers concerned.

3. List of Postgraduate Classes to be Conducted Online

A total of 5 classes (please refer to Attachment 1 for details) will be conducted online and they will be remarked with "Group D" in students' timetables. In these online classes, students' class attendance will not be considered but they will still be required to meet the participation requirements advised by the teachers concerned.

4. Preventive Measures against COVID-19 that have been Implemented from 25 October 2021

According to the advice from the Education and Youth Development Bureau (the DSEDJ), starting from 25 October 2021 onwards, staff and students of tertiary education institutions in Macao are required to **present the proof of having received at least the first dose of COVID-19 vaccine or the proof of negative nucleic acid test result which has been sampled within 7 days before entering the University.** If students fail to provide the abovementioned proof, they will NOT be allowed to enter the University or use any facilities in the campus, including the library, computer rooms, laboratories and residential colleges, etc. Students who fail to provide the abovementioned proof will be prohibited to attend the classes, thesis oral defence and report presentation on campus. Students will also be considered **ABSENT** during the said period.

For students who have received the COVID-19 vaccine

- Please make sure that you have submitted a valid “Proof of Receiving COVID-19 Vaccination” online and you may check the related record there.

For students who plan to undergo the nucleic acid test every week

- Please be reminded to submit the “Proof of Negative Nucleic Acid Test Result” online every week (link → [Collection of Proof of Negative Nucleic Acid Test Result \(Students\)](#)). **This online platform will be available for students’ submission of “Proof of Negative Nucleic Acid Test Result” during Friday morning 9:00 a.m. to Monday 9:00 a.m. every week.** Students must ensure that the proof you submitted can cover your classes from Monday to Sunday in the following week. **Students who fail to submit this proof online during the abovementioned period will be considered ABSENT for the whole week.** Any late submission of the said proof will not be accepted.
- According to the General Rules Governing PhD and Other Doctoral Degree Programmes, and General Rules Governing Master’s Degree & Postgraduate Certificate / Diploma Programmes, student who is ABSENT from a course for more than 20% of the teaching period in the aggregate will NOT be allowed to take the final examination and will receive a failing grade for that course.

5. Avoid Travelling

Travelling to and from different countries/regions is a risk factor for COVID-19, so it is important to consider carefully the necessity of the trip. Online classes will **NOT** be arranged for students who undergo mandatory isolation or medical observation resulted from travelling.
