

INSTRUCTIONS FOR MEDICAL EXAMINATION

1. Target

- 1.1 All new students of Doctoral, Master's and Postgraduate Certificate/Diploma Programmes and resuming students concerned must bear the 'Medical Examination Report' (GRS/Form/006), follow the requirement in accordance to point 2 below, and complete the medical examination at the related medical units.
- 1.2 The medical examination report is valid for 3 months only.
- 1.3 Exemption

If a student has already had a medical check-up in a 'Macao Government Health Centre' or 'Kiang Wu Hospital' within 3 months prior to registration, he/she may be exempted from having medical examination. But the student concerned must present the 'Medical Examination Report' (GRS/Form/006) to the 'Macao Government Health Centre' or 'Kiang Wu Hospital' and request the medical unit to complete the form with the necessary information.

2. Locations for Medical Examination

- Macao students: may go to any 'Macao Government Health Centre' or 'Kiang Wu Hospital' to complete the required medical examination procedures.
- Chinese Mainland students: must go to 'Kiang Wu Hospital' to complete the required medical examination procedures.
- Non-Macao students (except Chinese Mainland students): may go to any hospital in their country of origin or 'Kiang Wu Hospital' to complete the required medical examination procedures.

ATTENTION: Please pay attention to the following procedures before you go to the 'Macao Government Health Centre' or 'Kiang Wu Hospital' to complete the required medical examination:

Step1: Obtain a chest X-ray report from the Centre of Prevention and Treatment of Tuberculoses of Department of Health (Address: Estrada da Vitoria, no.40, Tel: (853) 2853 2196)	✓ Students may also complete a medical examination at the Kiang Wu Hospital at their own expense. Step 2: Present the chest X-ray report and bring the 'Medical Examination Report' and the vaccination record to a government-registered doctor of the Health Centre of your community during the schedules examination. Students should complete Part I of the 'Medical Examination Report' before the examination.	✓ Students should bring the 'Medical Examination Report' and the vaccination record in order to complete medical examination. Students should complete Part I of the 'Medical Examination Report' before the examination.

Students are advised to go to the related medical units to schedule appointment(s) for completing the above procedures as soon as possible, so as not to delay their admission procedures and classes.

3. Medical Examination Documents That Should be Submitted During Registration

- A completed 'Medical Examination Report' (The 'Medical Examination Report' is valid for 3 months from date of completion. It must bear the doctor's signature and the stamp of the hospital or medical centre where the medical examination has been conducted); and
- A copy of the vaccination record (For details of vaccination items please refer to the guidelines overleaf.)
 - A copy of Personal Immunization Record, including the pages about personal information and valid vaccination record. (Please bring along the original of the record upon submission of the 'Medical Examination Report' for checking when needed.); or
 - Macao students may login the personal account of "My Government Account of Macao SAR", select "Health" and print out the "Personal Vaccination Information". Both personal information and all the vaccination records should be printed while the fields of vaccines with multiple doses should be expanded by clicking "+" in order to show the complete vaccination record with dates.

The Report is used only for admission to University of Macau. The University has the right to verify the health status of students for admission purpose. Student must submit the 'medical examination report' in order to proceed the admission procedures, or he/she will not be allowed to attend classes.

Guidelines for Completing the Medical Examination at Kiang Wu Hospital

- 1. Students must bring along the following documents:
 - a. I.D. card or passport;
 - b. One recent photo;
 - c. Medical Examination Report (issued by the University of Macau);
 - d. Vaccination Record (Personal Immunization Record).
 - Please wear your glasses instead of contact lens.
- 3. Urine sample cannot be collected during menstruation period. It should be collected three days after the end of menstruation period.
- 4. Please do not take any X-ray examination if you are pregnant.
- 5. To ensure the reliability of your medical examination report, you must take the X-ray at Kiang Wu Hospital.

Guidelines for Submission of Vaccination Record

According to the regime of immunization to students of Higher Education Institutions by Health Bureau of Macao SAR, the vaccination record submitted during registration should include below vaccines.

Items	No. of Required Doses	Points to Note
1. Measles-containing vaccine	Minimum 2 doses	 Only applicable to persons born in 1970 or after; The two doses must be administered at least 4 weeks apart
2. Rubella-containing vaccine	Minimum 1 dose	 Only applicable to persons born in 1970 or after.
3. Tetanus-containing vaccine	Minimum 3 doses	• Doses must be given at least 4 weeks apart, and the most recent shot must be given within the past ten years.
4. Diphtheria and pertussis-containing vaccine	Minimum 1 dose	
5. Poliomyelitis-containing vaccine	Minimum 4 doses	 Only applicable to students from Pakistan and Afghanistan. Doses must be given at least 4 weeks apart.
